Olivia Whetung | inawendiwok On view until April 7, 2024

A member of Curve Lake First Nation and citizen of the Nishnaabeg Nation, Olivia Whetung draws upon her experience working on and with the land to create artworks that speak of the interdependence and relationality within our ecosystem. The exhibition — whose Anishinaabemowin title, inawendiwok, loosely translates as "they are related to each other" — comprises a series of sculptural installations, digital prints, and three-dimensional beadworks that articulate the vital connectivity between woodland, wetland, and garden environments. Whetung's poignant works underline the need to relinquish our human-centric outlook in favour of a renewed understanding of kinship in order to restore an ecology based on responsibility and reciprocity that can sustain the future.

VIRTUAL WORKSHOP



Join Olivia Whetung, contemporary artist, printmaker, writer, and member of the Curve Lake First Nation and citizen of the Nishnaabeq Nation, in this two-part introductory virtual workshop.

In this workshop, participants will learn peyote 'in the round'. This includes techniques such as tubular peyote and beading a peyote triangle. Core skills include the 'step up' and herringbone increases. Knowledge of flat peyote stitch is required.

SPECIAL DROP IN BEADING WORSHOPTHIS SUNDAY!

Join us at the Art Gallery of Mississauga on Sunday, March 17, 2024, for a drop-in beading workshop with Katie Longboat. Katie is a Cree and Mohawk beadwork artist from Six Nations of the Grand River Territory in Southern Ontario, with family connections in Thunder Bay and Northern Ontario. Her beadwork incorporates intricate designs, florals, contemporary materials, and bold colours to create unique jewelry pieces and beaded artwork. Katie is inspired to create work that is reflective of her family and background, the natural world, and draws inspiration from both Cree and Mohawk styles of beadwork. Katie currently resides in Toronto, Ontario.

Drop in between 1:00 and 3:00 PM. Registration is not required. First come, first served. Please note: This drop-in workshop is recommended for ages 14+. Due to the nature of the workshop and materials, parents with younger children are asked to supervise their children.

The Poetic Voices series at the Art Gallery of Mississauga is an important imitative. Last month we celebrated Black History Month with Ayòmide Bayowa the Mississauga Poet Laureate for 2021-2024. Ayòmide, a soft-spoken young man originally from Nigeria, shared his poetry and brought several of his original photo collage works to illustrate his work. His poems are imagistic and conjure ideas of travelling, diaspora, and longing. The group who attended also had the opportunity to craft their own poems and shared them afterwards. It was an illuminating and inspiring afternoon.
