The Art Gallery of Mississauga (AGM) has been awarded grant funding from the New Horizons for Seniors Program (NHSP) – Employment and Social Development Canada.

The Art Gallery of Mississauga (AGM), its leadership team, and staff are excited to announce that the AGM has been awarded grant funding from Employment and Social Development Canada and the New Horizons for Seniors Program (NHSP). The NHSP is a federal grants and contributions program that provides funding for projects that make a difference in the lives of seniors and in their communities.

The NHSP grant funding will support an AGM Intergenerational Art Project that will partner seniors with students from high schools studying art. Together they will work on an art project that tells a story about the senior's life and/or life experiences. An intergenerational art program provides an opportunity for older adults to connect to their community and lift them out of isolation. Art making aids several areas of mental health, such as providing alternate and supplementary forms of communication, building new skills and fostering a sense of identity.

The Executive Director is pleased to announce an exciting schedule of exhibitions and programming that continues to engage and connect with the vibrant community of Mississauga. Currently exhibiting until March 31st is a tribute to frontline workers, ... till all are healed, curated by Asma Mahmood showcasing 27 local Mississauga artists as well featuring artists Michele Taras and Charles Pachter. On March 27th at 2:00pm the AGM celebrates the International Day for the Elimination of Racism with an artist talk by Nadine Williams. The AGM is also featuring the return of the CONTACT photography festival in May and June. In addition to the exhibition schedule the AGM offers a robust schedule of online and in person workshops and artist talks.
